Rod & Tina's Corner

We have a story to tell. We are a family of seven; Rod, Tina, our oldest daughter, Rocio, our three sons, Jonathan, Isaac, Hosea and Reka, our adopted daughter from India. Reka is the only one with us at the ranch full time. Rocio is married and started her life in San Diego and our three sons are either in school and/or working their jobs in San Diego. On weekends we regroup and spend time together at the ranch. The social service department (DIF) last November asked us if we were willing to take on a four-year-old deaf girl at the ranch. She, Valentina, had been taken from her grandparents because of neglect, her mother was in a state

psychiatric ward hospital and the narcotic father was killed in Tijuana. Valentina had been in a halfway home for two years waiting for a placement. It is always hard for us to say no to children, especially knowing this would be a special case. After some prayer and talking with our immediate family we decided to take Valentina into our own home and be a foster family for her while a placement could be found for her. That decision to bring her into our home was a definite family life-changing decision. After one week with us we fell in love with her and decided to adopt her ourselves. The state was in agreement, so we have officially begun the adoption process. Valentina



has shown that she will not be an easy jump-into-the-Struiksm-family-routine type child. She is totally deaf and has had some lessons in Mexican sign language. She was spoiled at her other "home" and is not used to the word or sign "No"! What a task, but what a blessing she is. Bringing a five-year-old (her birthday is Dec 25!) into our house was not an easy decision because it will take us back to our toddler days but how can we say no to the opportunity to bring another child into the knowledge of knowing Jesus our Savior. Learning the Mexican sign language will be a challenge and we have some words down ("no" and "gentle" were on the top of the list) but with God's help we are hoping to see if she will be a candidate for cochlear implants. We are waiting for a US visa in order to get her to a San Diego children's hospital for her first appointment with an audiologist. This is our story, and we accept what God has planned for our growing family. We hope someday you can meet our new addition, Valentina. Blessings,

Most of the major projects at the ranch have come to a halt because of the Covid-19 pandemic and its' interruption of our groups coming down, so we are hoping to hire a contractor to construct this house and have it ready by the end of the summer so our university students can have a place to stay while they study in Ensenada.
